THE ROYAL FAMILY OF SPAIN IN THE 21ST CENTURY

Princess Leonor turned 18 years old. As the firstborn child of Queen Letizia and King Philip VI, she is heir to the Spanish throne. In accordance with tradition, like her father in 1986, Leonor took the oath of allegiance to the country's constitution on the day of her majority.

Spain's royal family plays an important symbolic role in the country and may have some influence on the economy.
